You will learn to take vital signs, perform CPR and the techniques for transferring patients in a health skills laboratory. Tours of area medical facilities and guest speakers round out this program. Career Majors

Medication Administration Technician - 16 Hours* (Students will take 525 hours of Health Careers Core courses in addition to the 16 hour Medication Administration Technician course for a total of 541 hours)

Medication Administration Technicians administer medications to residents in licensed settings such as group homes or residential care facilities. Students will learn legal and ethical concepts, liability factors when assisting clients, infection control, medication charting, medical emergency preparation and resident care.
