## Occupational Focus

The Surgical First Assistant program is an advanced level course for experienced operating room professionals who wish to become surgical assistants. As defined by the American College of Surgeons, the surgical assistant provides aid in exposure, hemostasis, and other intraoperative technical functions that will assist the surgeon to carry out a safe operation with optimal results for the patient. This role will vary based on the surgical operation, specialty area, and type of facility. Preoperative, intraoperative, and postoperative skills performed under direct supervision of the surgeon may include the following: positioning the patient, preparing the skin, providing visualization of the operative site, utilizing appropriate techniques to assist with hemostasis, participating in volume replacement or auto-transfusion techniques as appropriate, utilizing appropriate techniques to assist with closure of body planes, selecting and applying appropriate wound dressings, and providing assistance in securing drainage systems to tissue.

## Entrance Requirements

- Adults students only (age 18 or older)
- Must possess a working knowledge of operating room fundamentals
- Must be a CST (Certified Surgical Technologist) within 8 weeks of Surgical First Assistant program attendance, CNOR (Certified Nurse Operating Room), or PA-C (Physicians Assistant - Certified).
- Must be a graduate of a CAAHEP (Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs) accredited Surgical Technology program or of a Military medical training with surgical experience.
- Must have verifiable/documented current operating room scrub experience (minimum of 30 General Surgery, 20 Orthopedic Surgery, and 15 Gynecological Surgery cases) or currently working in the capacity of a first assistant.

## Additional Requirements

High School Diploma or GED

Prior to the start of the clinical practicum, students must:

- Undergo a criminal background check including sex offender registration as required by the Oklahoma Child Care Facilities Licensing Act that requires individuals providing care to children under the age of 18 to be free of any criminal history that would indicate a potential for violent abuse against another person. There is a \$15 fee for adults.
- Provide verification of immunizations through vaccination records, titer (blood test) results, or declination statements. A list of specific immunizations may be obtained through the Health Sciences Center by calling 828-1216.
- Have a current American Heart Association CPR for the Healthcare Provider card.
- Provide transportation to clinical sites.
- Adult students must pay a \$81 liability insurance fee for clinicals.

## Career Majors

**Surgical First Assistant - 650 Hours\***

Students in this major will learn the legal, ethical, moral and professional responsibilities of a surgical first assistant. They will study the disease process including specific types of pathologies associated with body systems and the impact of microorganism in the surgical environment including the risks to patients. Students will also study preoperative and intraoperative effects of drugs used in surgery, wound management techniques, suturing techniques, and perioperative care. They will also learn how to recognize certain complications and how to respond. There will also be a clinical portion to this major and students should obtain certification from National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting (NBSTSA) as a certified first assistant.

## College Credit

## Credentials/Industry Certifications

The Surgical First Assistant program at Tulsa Tech is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) in collaboration with the Accreditation Review Committee on Education in Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting (ARC-STSA) for both on-line (distance education) and face-to-face programs. Graduates of this program are eligible to sit for the first assistant certification exam sponsored by the National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting (NBSTSA), formerly the LCC-ST (Liaison Council on Certification). Those who pass the certification exam may use the credential Certified First Assistant (CFA™).
